As members of the Presentation Family (As a Presentation School Community), we ask God to bless us as we live the spirit of Edmund in our time.



Edmund Rice loved and was deeply rooted in the land and culture of Ireland. God of creation, give us the wisdom and creativity to face the challenge of climate change with courage. May we take seriously and act on the challenge placed before us by Pope Francis, in his great letter 'Laudato Si' on the care of the Earth, our common home. Lord, hear us.

The Irish Catholics of the generation into which Edmund Rice was born were the descendants of martyrs. We pray for all those who are persecuted because of their faith today. Lord, give them courage in difficult times. Help all of us to value and nurture our own faith. Lord, hear us.
